Jeong Se-hyun

Former Vice Minister of Unification of the ROK. Jeong Se-hyun served as President of Korea Institute for National Unification (KINU), Presidential Secretary for Unification Affairs at the Cheong Wa Dae, Director of South-North Dialogue at the National Unification Board (NUB). He holds a B.A. and M.A. from Seoul National University and a Ph.D. in International Relations from the same university. He is the author of *Prospects on the Unification of Korean Peninsula: A Comparison of the Two Korea's Unification Policies*.
