Hwang Doo-yun

Minister for Trade of the Korea Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Before assuming the current ministerial position, Minister Hwang was the president and CEO of the Korea Trade-Investment Promotion Agency. He began his career as a public servant at the Economic Planning Board in 1970, and devoted his career mostly to international trade affairs at the Ministry of Trade and Industry (MOTI).
