Koh Byung Chul

Koo Bon Ho is University Chair Professor of Economics at the University of Ulsan, and Visiting Professor at the School of Public Policy and Management, Korea Development Institute. Professor Koo was president of the KDI, the University of Ulsan, and the Korea Energy Research Institute, and also taught at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, and Georgia State University. He wrote many books and articles in the areas of financial reform, economic policy, and economic cooperation.

Park Joon-Kyung is a senior research fellow at the Korea Development Institute, specializing in economic development and structural change, industrial competition, and small- and medium-sized businesses. He received an M.A. and Ph.D. in Economics from Northwestern University, and authored *Evaluation of Research and Technology Development Program* (2002), and co-authored *Changes in East Asian Economic Environment and Responsive Strategies* (2001), among others.
