Kim Do-tae

Professor at Chungbuk National University. He holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from the Claremont Graduate School and is a former research fellow of the Korea Institute of National Unification, specializing in negotiation strategies and tactics. He authored *The Experiences of Resolving Division and Korean Unification*, and wrote “A Comparative Study of the North Korean Negotiation Behavior to that of the South,” “A Study of North Korean Negotiation Tactics,” among others.
